

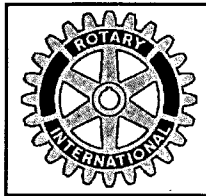

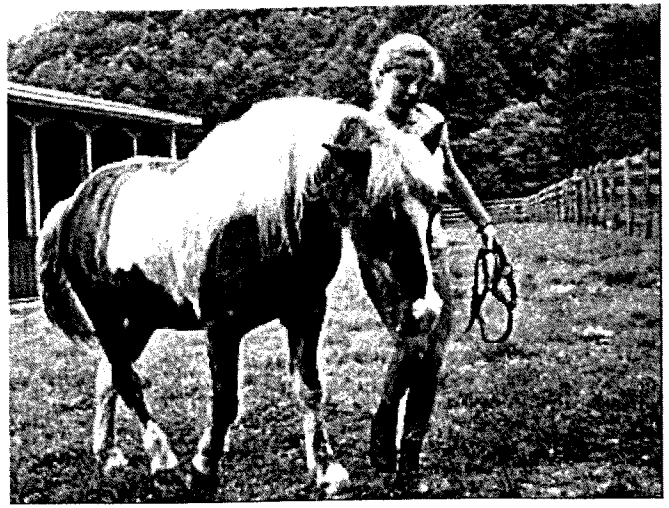

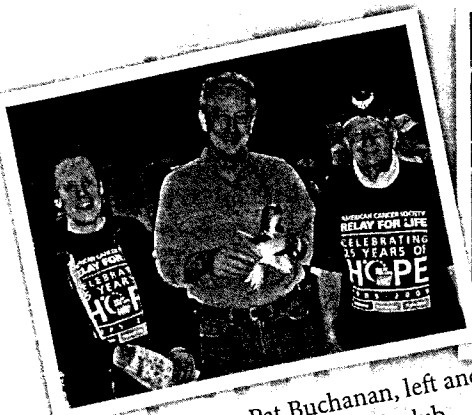
Manes & Tails Bingo This Thursday
