District has asked that Rotarians list their email address with District. Your email address on our web site, highlandsrotary.org, is separate.

You will need your Rotary number to complete this process. Your Rotary number appears above your mailing address on the Rotarian, your monthly Rotary magazine. Your Rotary number will look like: # 05128925 and note that there are 8 digits to the number.

This is how to do it:

Go to: www.rotary7670.org –this is our Rotary District website.

Click on: DACDB –and a new screen will come up.

Click on: enter the DaCdb

Now you'll be directed to sign in:

For your user name enter your email address such as: johnrotarian@hughes.net

For your password enter your Rotary number such as: 05128925 (note: 8 digits)

Click: login

On the new screen there are a line of tabs. Click on: Members

Your name will appear. Click on: Edit MY Data

Edit Member will appear. Enter your data here.

When you've finished with data entry click: Update at the bottom and you're finished.

If you are on our Highlands Rotary web site member directory, it does not mean that you are on the district list. These are separate email lists.

Please give this your attention – less than half of our Rotary is email listed with District.
