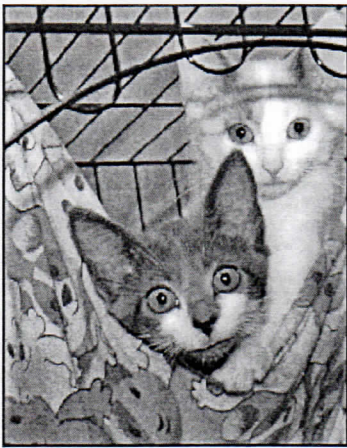

Cats and Dogs Bingo this Thursday

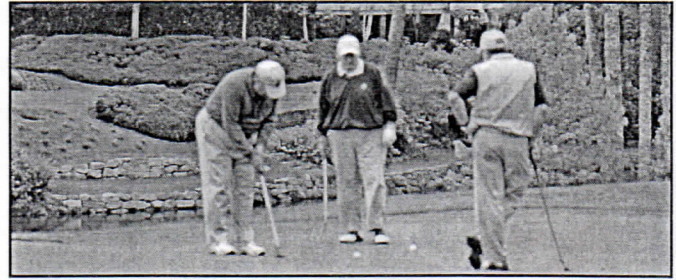

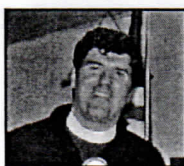
