Fellow Rotarians:

At last week's meeting, Mayor, Patrick Taylor recapped Highlands' experience with Covid from the early responses until now. Among other things, he said the town's budget was modified to rein back planned expenditures, assuming a possible negative impact on the local economy, including job losses, reduced sales tax revenue, depressed home sales with possible foreclosures. As the state has been gradually able to re-open, while the hospitality industry and non-profit income is down significantly, the retail industry; for the most part, seems to be less affected, and sales tax revenue has not been hurt as severely as first feared. Additionally, home sales, contrary to early forecasts, have soared in western North Carolina, as the virus is changing demographics. The influx of new permanent and second home owners will present its own challenges to the area. Mayor Taylor's greatest fear is that a second wave of the virus will force another curtailment of business activity. He also discussed the Highlands Community Plan and encouraged meeting attendees to fill out the related survey.
